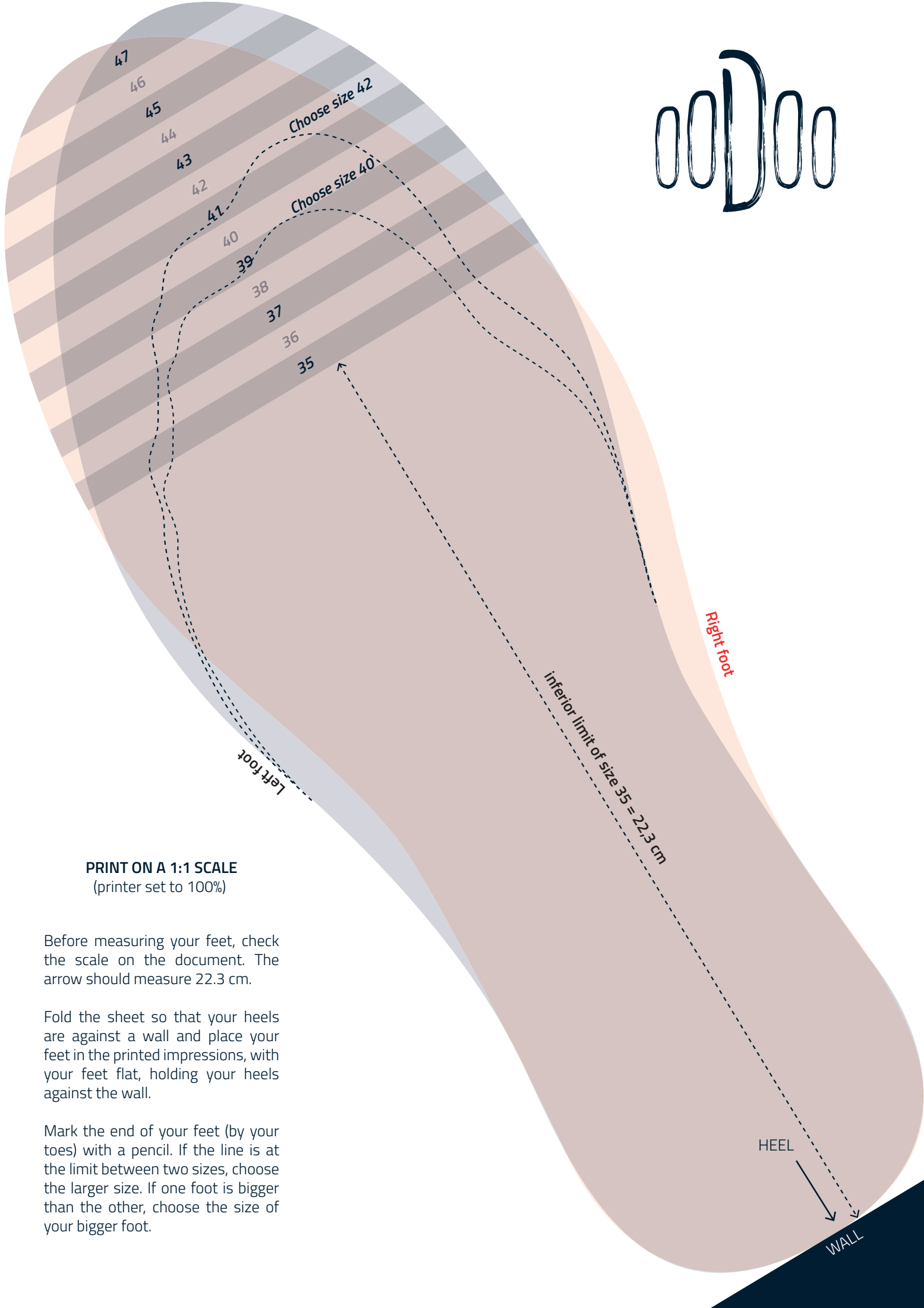
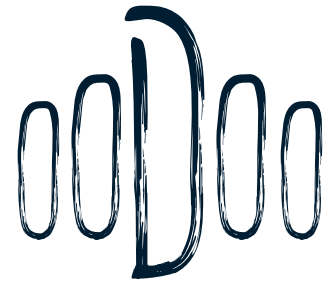


HOW DO YOU CHOOSE YOUR SIZE ?

Take the time to check your size to avoid having to exchange your shoes, and therefore two trips and unnecessary CO2 emissions. Download and print out our 'foot gauge.' Check the scale on the document by measuring the line corresponding to the inferior limit of size 35 which should measure 22.3 cm. Place your heels along the line one after the other, leaning against a wall, and with your feet flat, mark their ends with a pencil. It's common for one foot to be bigger than the other, so choose the size of your bigger foot!

You can also calculate your shoe size using the measurements in this equivalence table as a reference.





PRINT ON A 1:1 SCALE
(printer set to 100%)

Before measuring your feet, check the scale on the document. The arrow should measure 22.3 cm.

Fold the sheet so that your heels are against a wall and place your feet in the printed impressions, with your feet flat, holding your heels against the wall.

Mark the end of your feet (by your toes) with a pencil. If the line is at the limit between two sizes, choose the larger size. If one foot is bigger than the other, choose the size of your bigger foot.
